




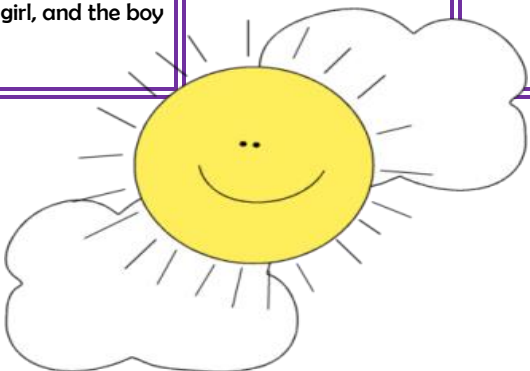

<p>Blow bubbles outside; talk about where they land</p> 	<p>Use magnetic tiles to make a tower; talk about the shapes of the tiles you use</p>	<p>Do actions outside (cartwheel, hopping, etc.) talk about if they are <i>easy/hard</i></p>	<p>Go shopping for new shoes for school; talk about what they will look like</p> 	<p>Collect rocks outside and count how many you find; talk about if you have the <i>same/more/less</i></p>
<p>Play house; talk about who will be Mommy, Daddy, the girl, and the boy</p>	<p>Draw with chalk and then get it wet; talk about what happens to the chalk</p>	<p>Write letters on post-its and stick them on things around your house that start with that letter</p>	<p>Clean up your outside toys; label each toy as you put it away</p>	<p>August 26th is National Dog day; go on a walk and count how many dogs you see</p>
