TASL-II WORKSHOPS

The Moog Center for Deaf Education is offering virtual and in-person sessions for professionals and future professionals working with students who are deaf or hard of hearing.

This is an opportunity for graduate students, teachers of the deaf, and speechlanguage pathologists to enhance their strategies and techniques for accelerating their students' progress in listening and spoken language using the TASL-II.

Workshop Opportunities:

- Full-day workshop: detailed explanation of what the TASL-II is and how to effectively use it with children who are deaf or hard of hearing, including assessment, lesson planning, and IEP development. Opportunities will be provided for language sample analysis, identifying targets, and observing sample lessons.
