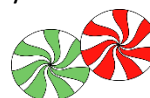


Talk about being kind; list different ways you can show kindness to friends at school.

Help decorate your house for the holidays; label the different decoration items.

Decorate holiday cookies with icing; practice making different shapes with the icing.

Make a gift wish list; write the name of each toy or cut and glue pictures of toys from a magazine.

Talk about why we wash our hands; list times/scenarios when we should wash our hands.

Open your refrigerator; find 2 things that start with the letter C.

Count all the fans in your house; talk about what a fan does.
