Sing and do movements to "Hokey Pokey."
Practice washing your hands; talk about the steps.	Make salt painted snowflakes; draw snowflakes with glue, sprinkle salt, then paint with watercolors.	Take a drive; count all the trucks you see.	Go to the library and find a book about polar bears.	Invite a friend to sit next to you at lunch.
Crumple up pieces of paper; have an indoor snowball fight with your family.	Draw a picture of your favorite toy; talk about what you drew.	Count how many forks are in the utensil drawer.	List 3 words that start with the letter C.	Find 4 things in your house that are purple.
